badger

verb - 1. (v.) to bother someone, to keep asking someone for something; 2. (n.) an animal that is part of the weasel family



frightened

adjective - feeling fear, afraid



temper

verb - 1. (n.) a quality of being angry or likely to become angry; calmness; 2. (v.) to calm, to soothe; to make stronger (as in a metal)



theme

noun - a topic or idea that comes up again and again in a work of art or literature; a specific idea or quality (e.g., a birthday party with a 1990s theme); a short tune that a piece of music is based on



spare

verb - 1. (v.) to not harm or use; 2. (adj.) something extra (e.g., a spare tire); not using a lot of something, meager; 3. (n.) an extra part; (bowling) the act of clearing 10 pins with only two balls



immediately

adverb - right away



excited

adjective - showing a lot of (usually happy) emotion and feeling



inquisitive

adjective - curious, asking a lot of questions



carry

verb - to take from one place to another; to wear on the body; to have for sale; to go over a distance (e.g., his voice carried across the room); to win (e.g., she carried the election)



wonder

noun - appreciation and surprise, often for something beautiful
